The Dee Estuary Voluntary Wardens scheme was set up by Wirral Borough Council at the request of English Nature in 1986 to protect wader roosts at times of high water and to monitor their movements.

From September to March, on West Kirby beach, teams of Voluntary Wardens:

- Prevent disturbances to wading bird roosts at high water
- Monitor the wading bird roosts
- Show the birds to passers-by
